Specifically, these programs are Cooperating Raleigh Colleges, National Student Exchange, International Student Exchange, NC State sponsored study abroad programs, and the affiliated hospital programs in medical Technology. To be eligible for degree honor designations, students must have completed at least two semesters and at least 30 credit hours at NC State. These designations are: · Cum Laude for grade point averages of 3.25 through 3.499; Magna Cum Laude for grade point averages of 3.5 through 3.749; and Summa Cum Laude for grade point averages of 3.75 and above.
